POSITION SUMMARY

The Head of Aquatics is responsible for all aspects of the Aquatics program and is a swim instructor, coach, program coordinator and pool manager.

SUPERVISED, EVALUATED BY AND REPORTS TO:

Director of Athletics and Activities and Educational Programs (for curriculum).

OVERVIEW OF RESPONSIBILITIES

- 0.3 teaching
- Flexible work hours (all curricular hours must be met)
- Weekends and event/meets (as approved by the direct supervisor)
- After School Coaching: 3 of 4 seasons, with the role of Head Coach once per division, as approved by the direct supervisor

QUALIFICATIONS

- Valid Physical Education degree and teaching certification
- Must be certified as a Water Safety Instructor or equivalent
- Must have previous experience in a management or supervisory position at a similar aquatic center
- Must have current certification in standard first aid or equivalent
- Must have current certification in American Red Cross, C.P.R. or equivalent
- Must have lifeguard certification
- Strong team player who has excellent interpersonal, management, and leadership skills

Responsibilities will include:

- Planning and overseeing the School's aquatics programs and services, including curricular and extra-curricular programs
- Ensuring the quality and related safety of the programs (before, during, and after school)
- Acting as the lead SAS Swim Instructor by administering, supervising and promoting the SAS swimming program, as well as training staff in swimming instruction
- Supervising the day-to-day operations of the pool facility, staff, supplies and equipment
- Actively collaborating with the PE department and with the Head of Aquatics on the other SAS campus

Aquatics Curriculum and Instructional Practices

- Coordinate the development, implementation and evaluation of a SAS K-12 curricular swimming program in conjunction with the Physical Education department and Educational Programs
- Create the curricular swimming schedule, in cooperation with the K-12 Physical Education Department
- Develop cross campus professional development opportunities for aquatics teachers
- Model Instructional techniques for other swim instructors
- Reflect and develop instructional practices with the swim instructors
- Take responsibility for teaching lifeguarding, instructor courses and first aid to faculty
- Teach aquatics classes within the PE curriculum

Facility Management

- Take responsibility for the scheduling, promotion, and safety of all aquatic programs and services.
- Take responsibility for writing and/or revising policies and procedures that relate to the Aquatics Center and the swimming program (emergency procedures and drills, safety related policies)
- Observe and enforce all rules and regulations of the facility
- Take responsibility for the supervision of day-to-day operations of the Aquatics Center including monitoring the maintenance, security and safety of the overall pool environment
- React and handle all emergency situations in the aquatics facility and play a role in the school wide Emergency action plan
- Manage all aspects of organizing and running swim meets and events
- Set and oversee safety standards for all events in the Aquatics Center

ASA and Non-curriculum Responsibilities

- Represent SAS at Shanghai Swim League meetings along with Director of Athletics and Activities
- Manage all aspects of organizing and running events hosted in the aquatics facility
- Develop a strong ASA competitive swim program across all divisions
- Prepare practice plans with developmentally appropriate techniques for a competitive swim program
- Take responsibility for all aspects of the afterschool aquatics programming, including hiring
 of staff, evaluation of programs and staff, scheduling of practices and meets and growing the
 program
- Work in collaboration with the Director of Athletics and Activities to create a budget for the implementation of the ASA program

- Take responsibility for the supervision of lifeguards and other staff working in the Aquatics Center.
- Be the supervisor in charge at all home events that are held in the aquatics center or delegate a capable replacement
- Take responsibility for the supervision of lifeguards and other staff working in the Aquatics Center
